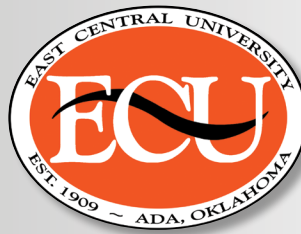

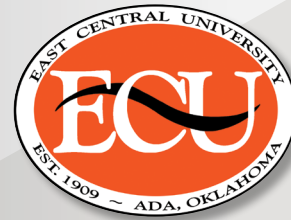

Letter from the Foundation Chair

The formal Mission Statement for the Foundation is provided in this report (see inside front cover). Put another way, our mission is to *"Leverage the love of the Tiger Nation for the benefit of East Central University"*. Of course, the Foundation must ask itself and answer to you - "So, how well are we accomplishing our mission?" There are a number of *Key Performance Indicators* the Foundation's Board measures to answer this question (see pgs 6-7).

Although these results are generally positive, the Foundation Board recognizes several opportunities to significantly improve our results. These include:

1. Advancement Committee – During the year the Foundation Board created an Advancement Committee to go along with the existing Audit, Investment, Scholarship and Nominating Committee. The purpose of the Advancement Committee is to:

- a. Ensure the Foundation's alumni data base is complete, accurate and up to date.
- b. Educate faculty and alumni regarding the Foundation Campaign Template. The Campaign Template provides a road map for completing a Campaign proposal.
- c. Evaluate Campaign proposals to determine viability, associated alumni passion, congruence with the ECU Master Plan and potential to create excellence.

d. Allocate Foundation and ECU Alumni Association resources to assist with Campaign Execution for selected campaign proposals. Because of the Foundation's limited resources, our slogan must be "You can build it, we can help".

2. High Impact Campaign Execution – The Foundation seeks to leverage its resources through partnering with faculty and alumni in executing high impact campaigns supporting those initiatives alumni are passionate about and those initiatives designed to create excellence.

3. Match Funding – The Foundation Board recently established a minimum unrestricted fund balance of 200% of the Foundations annual operating budget. Unrestricted balances in excess of this amount may be used to establish scholarships, provide match funding incentives for prospective campaigns or the establishment of additional endowments for specified needs of the University.

The first significant campaign approved by the Advancement Committee is the Commitment to Championships Campaign or "C3". C3 seeks to obtain \$5M in donations and pledges to establish an income-producing endowment. This is the first step in ECU becoming the dominant football program in this area of the country and the Great American Conference.

If you and your ECU friends are passionate about creating excellence in a specific area of the University and are willing and able to put work behind an opportunity, we encourage you to learn more about the Foundation's Campaign Development Program. History Of The East Central University Foundation, Inc.

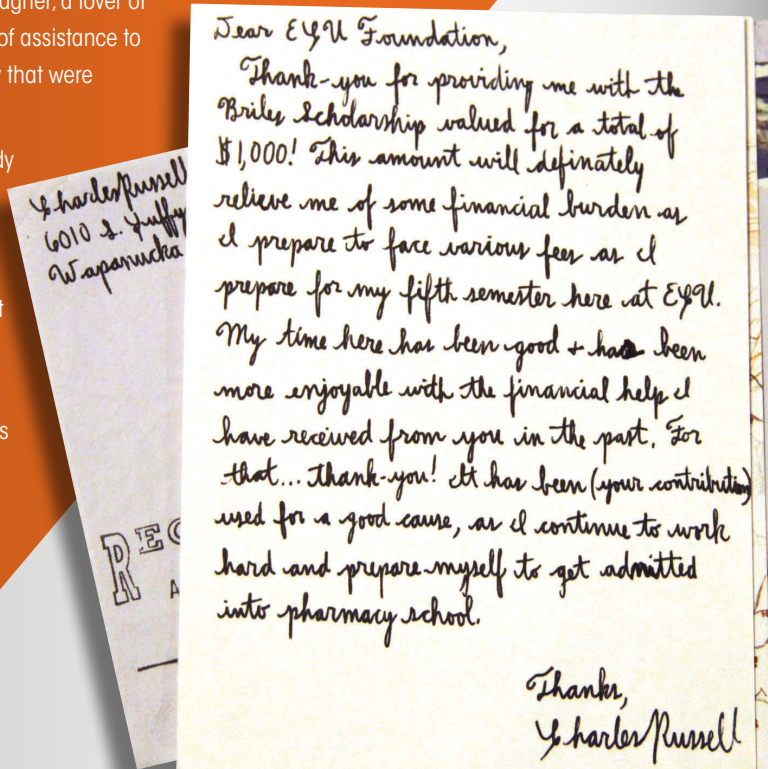
The East Central University Foundation, Inc., was established in February of 1970 with a total contribution of \$2000 from five alumni and one University President. *Did they have any idea of the dynamic, positive impact that their actions would have on the future of ECU, its faculty, staff and students?* Probably not, but from that modest beginning, the support given to ECU programs has grown to include an asset level of over \$26 million, yearly scholarships being awarded to over 400 students, and many worthwhile activities from faculty positions to new facilities being funded through investment earnings as well as through special fundraising appeals.

The five alumni (*R. Burl Harris, W. Harvey Faust, James A. Thomas Sr., Hugh Warren, and Oscar L. Parker*) shared a dream with Dr. Stanley Wagner, who was the President of ECU in 1970, to establish a Foundation which would attract to the University and the Ada community a group of students who exceeded the academic ability of their peers, and who were deserving and in need of assistance while attending ECU. Dr. Wagner, a lover of the fine arts, also hoped that the Foundation would provide a means of assistance to bring certain cultural activities to the community and to the University that were unique and stimulating.

For the first twenty years, the Foundation experienced slow and steady growth. By 1990, the endowment level had grown to approximately \$2 million, and the income from investments was used almost exclusively to fund scholarships for incoming freshmen at ECU. There have been fundraising campaigns and an increase in benevolent donors throughout the years that have aided the Foundation in reaching its current asset level of over \$26 million.

The ECU Foundation has certainly fulfilled and exceeded Dr. Wagner's and his colleagues' dream by attracting quality students, and also by bringing outstanding cultural programs to the campus. In addition, several new facilities have been built with Foundation assistance, and the number of benefactors and their contributions is growing with each passing day.

Thanks to all of you who have been an integral part of this Foundation's history, and who will be the key to the Foundation's future.

Dr. Carl Rutledge has established this endowment in memory of his wife Paula, who taught math at both the secondary and university levels. Paula was a great educator, and loved to see students understand and comprehend math concepts which they once thought were too difficult for them. This scholarship will be awarded for the first time in Fall 2014.

How Does an Endowment Work?



A donor gives to the Foundation to establish a named endowed scholarship in an area of his or her passion. The minimum amount for a Foundation Endowment is \$10,000, while the minimum for Centennial Endowment recognition is \$15,000.

The gift is entered into the ECU Foundation Endowment fund.

The donor works with the Foundation to develop criteria for the scholarship and guidelines for the distribution. A scholarship agreement is signed by both parties.

The Foundation's Investment Committee invests the donor's gift in accordance with established investment objectives to maximize returns and minimize risk.

A portion of the earnings on the invested funds will be used for distribution as scholarships to students, while the fund's principal amount remains intact.

By reinvesting the remainder of the earnings, the scholarship continues to grow and is protected from inflation, providing annual support to ECU's students for decades to come.

What is a Centennial Endowment?

This term was developed in 2009 which was ECU's Centennial year. Dr. Duane C. Anderson, provost and vice president for academic affairs, was serving as interim president that year. He challenged the University and the departments to raise five \$15,000 scholarships which would be called "Centennial Endowments" in honor of ECU's

100th birthday. To his surprise (and delight!) a total of 21 centennial endowments was established that year for a total of \$455,000! This tradition has continued on, with eleven Centennial Endowments in 2010, ten in 2011, eleven in 2012, and twelve in 2013 — **65 in all for a total of \$1,470,000!**

Higginbotham Family Luncheon

On November 12, 2013, 17 members of the Higginbotham family, 16 scholarship recipients, and several faculty and staff members gathered in ECU Foundation Hall to honor and celebrate the memory of Dorothy Higginbotham, 1947 alumna from ECU.

Dorothy, who passed away in 2005, left a \$1M gift to the ECU Foundation to be used for scholarships. She came from a family of 10 children, and nine of the 10 either attended and/or graduated from ECU, and her focus and passion on education came from a family in which six of the seven girls ultimately became teachers.

Ada resident and former ECU instructor Billie Jean Floyd spent time with Dorothy in education classes and also in the Tri Sigma Sorority. They even shared a house for a while in their young teaching careers in the Duncan School System. "I taught third grade and she taught speech and drama at Duncan High School," said Floyd. "She also

coached the debate team at Duncan... she was a sharp, witty person... a very efficient and smart person who was lots of fun to be around and also good for clean fun and a laugh."

Melody Kruger, one of Dorothy's sisters, remembers her as a stern but popular teacher. "She helped a lot of people. When we were cleaning out her house and estate after she died, we realized she had loaned money to a lot of people we didn't know, and a lot of it was education-related."

Dorothy spent more than 20 years at OU as a professor, associate dean and director of graduate studies. She assisted many students by directing their doctoral dissertations, and was recognized by OU for her worldwide expertise in the use and development of children's language, especially as it related to and interacted with culture, ethnicity and cognition.

Nikki Stonecipher Memorial Golf Tournament

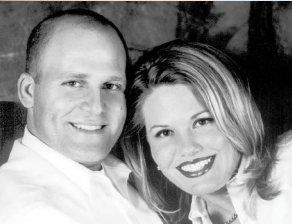

Proceeds from these golf tournaments go directly to a fund established at the Foundation in Nikki's name which provides tuition, fees, books, and housing for 8 semesters. This scholarship has provided assistance to 20 students for a total of over \$200,000, and total donations including proceeds from both of these tournaments has reached almost \$600,000.



Nikki and her parents, Brent and Tina Stonecipher, were killed in a tragic plane accident in 2005. Mike Turpen, a good friend of Harland and Shirley Stonecipher (Nikki's grandparents), encouraged them to establish something in Nikki's memory that would keep her legacy alive. Harland and Shirley have truly turned the worst tragedy imaginable into a blessing for so many students!

Mike and Leslie Dicus Memorial Golf Tournament

The untimely death of both Mike and Leslie Dicus led Mike's parents to establish an accounting scholarship at ECU in memory of their son and daughter-in-law. The golf tournament which bears their names benefits the ECU Foundation on a rotating basis with the OU Foundation and the OU Peggy and Charles Stevenson Cancer Center. Over \$12,000 per year is awarded to ECU accounting students, both undergraduate and graduate, as a result of the Dicus' benevolence.



Virgil Taylor Memorial Golf Tournament

Virgil Taylor was a 1970 graduate of ECU, and obtained his master's degree in rehabilitation counseling from OSU in 1975. He embraced the rehabilitation philosophy and dedicated his life to helping people with disabilities. ECU held a specific place in his heart, and this tournament was organized after his death in 2008 with proceeds going to the Virgil Taylor Centennial Rehabilitation Endowment at the ECU Foundation. This fund assist students at the undergraduate level to pursue a career in vocational rehabilitation counseling, and the balance continues to grow each year as a result of this tournament.

Dr. Tim Green Memorial Golf Tournament

Alumni, community members and ECU supporters attend the Dr. Tim Green Memorial Golf Tournament each year to celebrate the life of Dr. Green. He was ECU's director of athletics from 1981-2006, and was also an instructor in reading education early in his career. He was the recipient of numerous honors in both the athletic and educational areas, and oversaw the addition of four sports during his tenure at ECU.

Dr. Gil Morgan, an ECU alum and PGA Champions Tour Professional, has been featured at each of the golf tournaments, and has presented a golf exhibition at each.

The Dr. Tim Green Centennial Endowment at the ECU Foundation assists with awards to reading specialists and to support athletic programs.



Daniel Minnich Memorial Golf Tournament

In 2008, Daniel Minnich was in his student teaching semester at ECU when he died from complications of Crohn's Disease. His parents organized a golf tournament that year at the Jimmy Austin Golf Course in Seminole, and all proceeds from subsequent years have been used to establish the Daniel Minnich Education Scholarship at the ECU Foundation. An annual scholarship is awarded to assist an education major in his/her semester of student teaching.

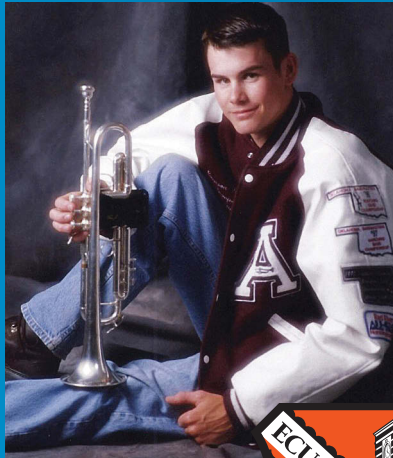

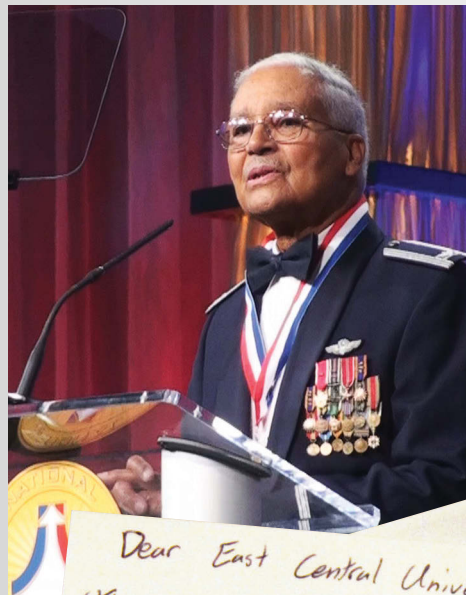
Louise Young Diversity Lecture

On March 11, 2014, Colonel Charles McGee delivered the sixth annual Louise Young Diversity Lecture in the Ataloo Theatre of ECU's Hallie Brown Ford Fine Arts Center. Colonel McGee was one of the famed Tuskegee Airmen, a group of African-American pilots who fought in World War II. Having served heroically in three wars, he is the recipient of the Congressional Gold Medal of Honor, and holds the Air Force record of 409 fighter combat missions flown in World War II, Korea, and Vietnam.

"Colonel Charles McGee overcame great barriers of racial segregation to become one of the U.S. Air Force's most decorated pilots," states Dr. Louise Young. "The story of the Tuskegee Airmen of World War II is both inspiring and extraordinary. . . . It is an honor for me to be able to bring this exciting evening to my hometown and my alma mater, ECU."

Those who attended the lecture were able not only to hear Colonel McGee, but also to have one of his books (written by his daughter, Dr. Charlene E. McGee Smith) personalized by him and to receive a special gift: a dog tag bearing the image of the iconic Red Tail airplane and the principles of the Tuskegee Airmen on the reverse side.

Dr. Young is a graduate of Ada Public Schools and ECU (1969). She earned a master's and doctorate degree from the University of Colorado. From 1971 to 1974, she was an instructor of geography at ECU, and then worked for Raytheon Company as a senior software engineer for 34 years. In 2008, she established this endowed lectureship within the ECU Foundation with the goal of presenting an annual free lecture for students, faculty and community members on various aspects of diversity.

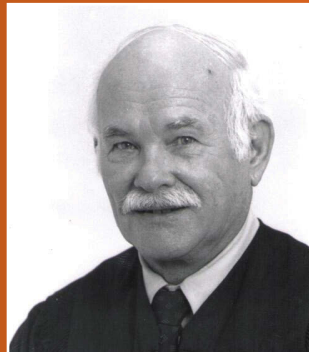
Grand Opening of Chickasaw Business and Conference Center

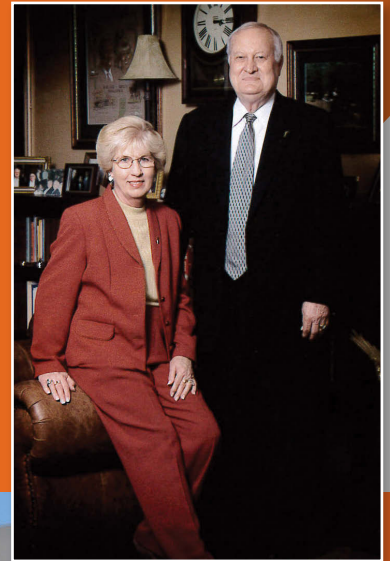

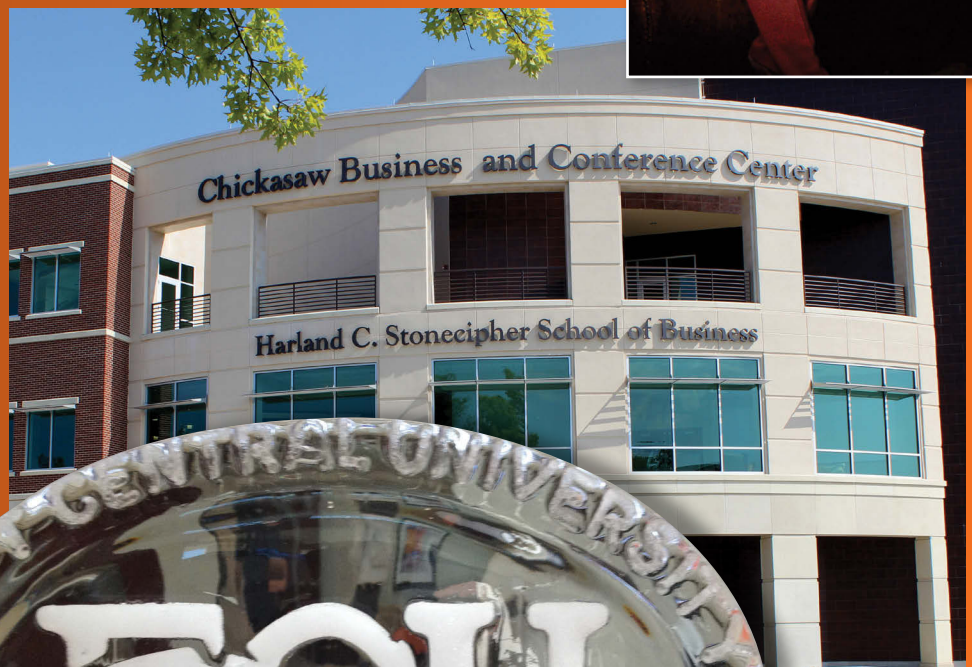

Campus Campaign

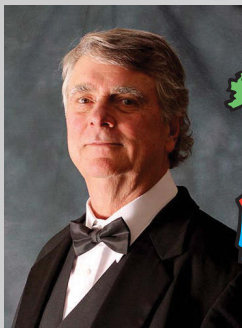

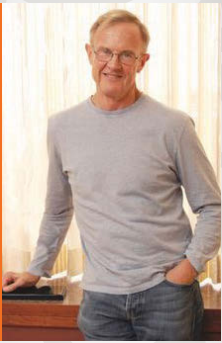

The Landrum Art Donation



Marquis Landrum grew up in Tishomingo, Oklahoma, where his father owned First State Bank and his mother taught school. Later the family moved to Hobbs, New Mexico, where Mark graduated first in his class in 1957, and was also a standout basketball player. He later studied at Yale University and Harvard Law School, receiving a juris doctorate in 1967. After his untimely death in 2012, it was revealed that he had left an amazing art collection which was bequeathed to Oklahoma University, Yale University, and East Central University Foundation, Inc.

The Landrum Collection opened in August 2013 and includes 27 three-dimensional works, almost entirely of non-western origin, housed in various galleries throughout the Hallie Brown Ford Fine Arts Center. "It is unbelievable that the ECU Foundation is loaning this amazing collection to the University," states Dr. Taryn Chubb, assistant professor of art. Dr. Brad Jessop adds, "The donation was a significant boom to this university. It has filled in the gaps with our current collection."

Art students and their professors have been studying and researching the works since installation. "This is an experience that most undergraduate students do not get," Chubb said. "They will be at a definite advantage when they go to graduate school. Most of their colleagues will not have had this type of hands-on experience."

Items include eight stone sculptures from Southeast Asia on display in the Inasmuch Sculpture Garden, a funeral shroud from Peru, a Thai vessel encrusted with sea life from the bottom of the ocean, a warrior shield from the Asmat Tribe (Papua, New Guinea), a Chinese hunting table, and a forged iron knife from the Sudan. The oldest and most interesting item in the collection is a Napu Ancestor Head from the Napu Valley in north central Sulawesi, Indonesia. This work is over 3000 years old, and has been the focus of extensive student research.

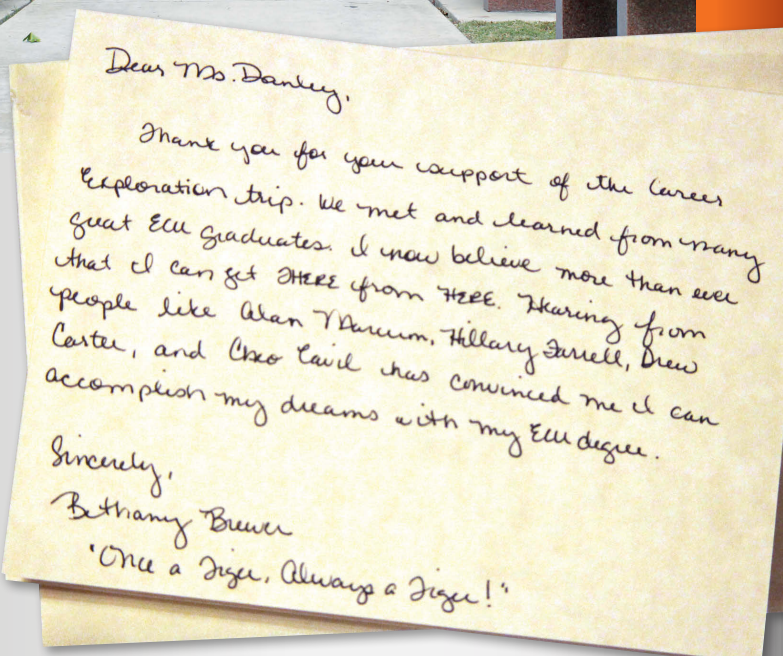

ECU's alumni and other supporters have created endowments at the Foundation to help recruit and maintain faculty members and aid the University in other ways in the form of Chairs, Professorships, and Lectureships. The minimum monetary gift

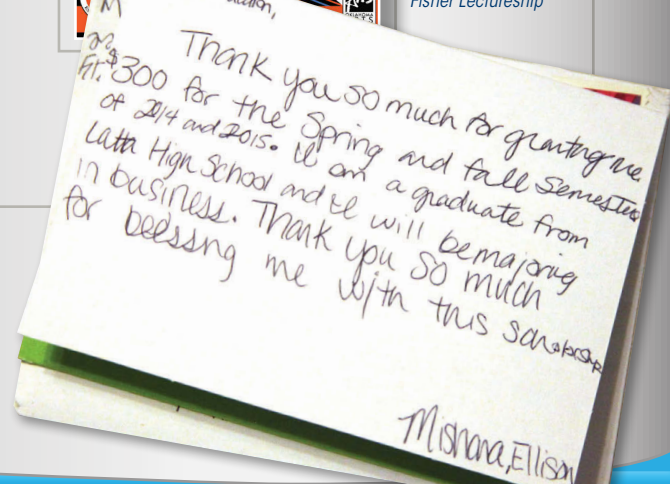

How to Give to the Foundation

Donors give to the Foundation for many different reasons. Some want to repay the investment that others made in them. Some want to give a gift that adds value to the University, and that also brings deeper meaning to their lives. Some simply want to support the ECU family and make a positive impact on faculty, staff and students of the future. Whatever the reason, donor gifts are important to the Foundation and to the University, and we want to make sure that you are aware of all of the different ways that you can donate.

The Foundation will accept any level of gift, and in all cases, the wishes of the donor will be the guiding principal as to how the funds are used. Donors frequently specify an endowed scholarship, academic department fund, endowed lectureship/professionship/chair or capital improvement project as the target of their benevolence.

The Foundation encourages you to discuss the various methods of giving with your accountant and/or attorney in order to select the giving mechanism which best fits your circumstances. Flexible options allow you to demonstrate your commitment and maximize your support of the University's mission. The most common types of gifts are:

Gifts of Cash, Check, or Credit Card

These gifts are always welcome because they are available immediately to strengthen the Foundation and the University, or begin earning income for the future.

Gifts of Securities

These gifts include stocks, bonds, mutual funds and IRAs, and are also available immediately to impact the work of the Foundation. *Thanks to John and Kay Hargrave, Jane Muntz, and Rodney and Janice Gray for their gifts of stock to the Foundation!*

Gifts of Personal Property

Personal property can include coin collections, antique cars, gun collections, artwork, musical instruments, etc. *Thanks to the Marquis Landrum estate for the Landrum Art Donation, and Landmark Bank for the tiled "Barcelona" benches!*

Gifts of Real Property

Real estate, homes, business property and farmland that have grown in value can result in capital gains taxes if sold, or tax advantages are available through a charitable gift to the Foundation. When the Foundation acquires your gift of appreciated stock or property, you receive a tax deduction equal to its fair market value and also avoid costly capital gains tax on the increase in value.

Gifts-in-Kind

Donations of software, licenses, services, vendor products, and other property also support the mission and programs of ECU. These gifts-in-kind allow the Foundation to use our resources for other needs while you get credit for your support. *Thanks to Don Kellogg, Phyllis Danley, Martha Rhynes, Gerald Williamson, Gem Jewelers of Ada, Stableridge Winery, John and Kay Hargrave, Shannon Overstreet, Dr. Steve Walker, The Office Leader, and Landmark Bank for gifts-in-kind!*

Gifts of Trusts

This can include charitable remainder trusts, unitrusts, lead trusts, family trusts, annuity trusts, etc., that can avoid capital gains taxes and provide an annual income for life.

Gifts of Insurance

Naming the Foundation as the owner and beneficiary of your life insurance policy is also an option, especially when your policy has a face amount that is much greater than the amount you could afford to give in cash. By assigning ownership to the Foundation and making the Foundation the beneficiary of an old policy that is no longer needed for its original purpose, such as sheltering children's education, you can make a substantial gift at a low cost and take an immediate income tax deduction for the value of the policy. You can then contribute an amount equal to the policy's premiums to the Foundation and deduct that gift as a charitable contribution. Proceeds of the policy will pass to the Foundation free of estate taxes. New policies may also be obtained listing the Foundation as the owner and/or beneficiary as a part of financial or estate planning. *Thanks to Leslie Hamilton, Annette Webb, Don Kellogg, and Mike Brown for your gift of life insurance policies!*

The Ultimate Gift

The will is the most widely used estate-planning tool in America today. A simple document that is easily drafted and updated, it remains the most popular method of planned giving for almost every charity, including the ECU Foundation.

There are five types of charitable bequests you can make when directing all or part of your estate to the Foundation:

General Bequest: an agreed-upon dollar amount.

Specific Bequest: a specific, identified property or security, including real estate, stocks, or bonds.

Residuary Bequest: all or a portion of an estate's property after all debts, taxes, expenses and other bequests have been made.

Contingent Bequest: the Foundation serves as an alternate beneficiary in case a beneficiary dies or disclaims a bequest.

Restricted Bequest: any of the above bequests with a specific purpose for the property, such as establishing a scholarship or endowment.

While a will can be a simple and effective option for many, a living trust might allow assets to be distributed to heirs without the delays or costs of probate. Be sure to consult with a qualified professional before you draft your will or trust, and review it often.

Generosity Close to Home

The ECU Foundation is the recipient of many gifts throughout each year, but two families have become closely involved with students and with programs that are close to their hearts.

Don and Jane Kellogg are long-time Ada residents, former educators, and co-owners of Kellogg and Sovereign Consulting, LLC. Along with Jane's daughter and son-in-law **Debi and Mike Sovereign** (also co-owners of Kellogg and Sovereign Consulting, LLC), they have established the "Kellogg and Sovereign Financial Lab" in the Chickasaw Business and Conference Center. The lab consists of an interactive Market Wall, which streams live data from stocks and bond markets with only a 20-minute delay. The board tracks the Dow and other market news as well, and provides students with the hands-on experience needed to succeed in today's market.

In addition to the funding of this lab, the **Kellogg's** and **Sovereign's** have also established the "Kellogg and Sovereign Business Scholars Program" which will reward excellence in academics for business students. They also have a scholarship for students who are planning to be science teachers, and have provided additional funds for education technology and business initiative potential.

The **Morgan Family Foundation**, established by Dr. Gil Morgan and his wife **Jeanine**, has contributed to ECU in several different ways throughout the past year. Drawing on their family's

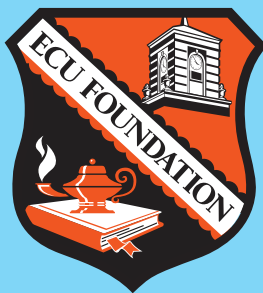
