The College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences is home to four departments and two interdisciplinary programs with an additional two departments. School offerings include 22 majors and 27 minors.

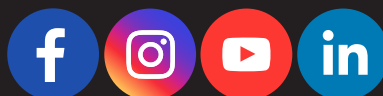

> DEGREE OPTIONS

> Art + Design : Media + Communication

This department offers a bachelor of fine arts degree with concentrations in studio art, art education and graphic design and minors in art and media/ graphic arts, a bachelor of arts degree with a concentration in Strategic Communication, and a bachelor of arts degree with concentrations in Mass Media or Advertising/Public Relations. It also offers minors in Art Therapy, Mass Communication, Game Design, and Media/ Graphic Art. The department is housed in the Hallie Brown Ford Fine Arts Center and has state-of-the-art studios for drawing, painting, printmaking, ceramics, sculpture, digital imaging, audio and video.

> English and Languages

The Department of English and Languages offers a major in English and English Teacher Certification, and minors in English and Humanities. Students in the department's major and minor programs enhance the reading and writing skills that are important in a variety of careers, absorb cultural understanding, and develop critical thinking skills.

> History

The History Department offers bachelor of arts majors in History and History Teacher Certification. Minors are also offered in History and Oklahoma Studies. The department emphasizes developing the skills to think critically, analyze information, solve problems, and communicate with others.

> Native American Studies

The Native American Studies program offers an interdisciplinary major and minor that enables students to understand Native America from multiple perspectives.

> Performing Arts

The Department of Performing Arts offers majors with concentrations in vocal or instrumental music, music education, along with a minor in music. It also provides entertainment for both the campus and community.

> Politics, Law and Society

The Department of Politics, Law, and Society offers degrees in political science and legal studies, along with a minor in sociology. The bachelor of arts in political science emphasizes critical thinking and written and oral communication skills. The bachelor of science in legal studies emphasizes skills that will be applicable in the law office. Both degrees study the connection between law and politics and are popular avenues to law school.

> Professional Programs in Human Services

The Department of Professional Programs in Human Services offers bachelor of arts degrees in Criminal Justice and Human Services Counseling with concentrations in Counseling as well as a Social Work degree. Minors offered include Addictions, Criminal Justice, Human Service Counseling, and Social Work. All offered fully online.

> Interdisciplinary Studies

The bachelor of arts in Interdisciplinary Studies offers a non-traditional route to a college degree for adult learners. The program offers a unique mix of web-based and field experience courses combined with courses from other programs to create a major tailored to an individual student's career and/or personal goals. This program is also offered completely online.
