NOTES

- ⇒ Articulated using EOOSC's A.A. in English without a minor. No minor required.
- ⇒ A student transferring with an Associate degree in Arts or Science from EOOSC fulfills ECU's general education requirement by transferring his or her credit to East Central University. Transferring credit for general education does not eliminate or otherwise affect any of the following ECU requirements: (1) prerequisites; (2) specific requirements in majors, minors or related work in these areas; or (3) the requirements for teacher certification. General Education equivalencies can be found by referring to either the Oklahoma State Regents Transfer Matrix or the ECU Transfer Matrix. Both matrices can be found at www.ecok.edu by clicking on *Academics* and scrolling down to *Course Transfer Matrix*.
- ⇒ A student must earn at least 40 semester hours in upper-division courses (numbered 3000 or higher). A course taught at EOOSC may equate in content to an ECU 3000-4000 level course, but it will not be counted as part of the 40 hours of upper level courses.
- ⇒ A student must earn at least 60 semester hours, excluding physical activity courses, at a baccalaureate degree granting institution.
- ⇒ A student must earn at least 120 credit hours that apply to an ECU Bachelor's degree.
